The contribution is in support of the Company's ongoing studies ("Studies") to undertake pre-construction and project dativities at the Company's flagship Crawford Nickel Sulphide Project ("the Project"), primarily focusing on electrical infinite Studies are a crucial step for Canada Nickel and the Government of Canada to safeguard the development of clear infrastructure that drives innovation in the mining sector.
